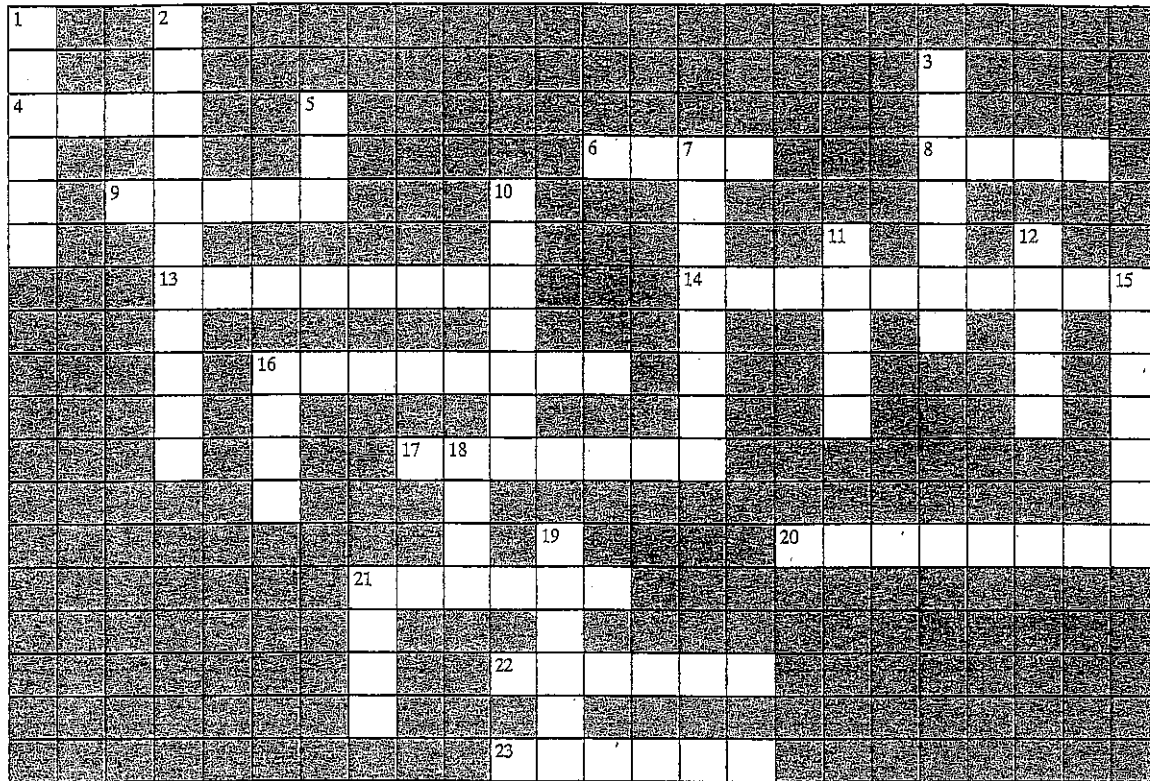


Crossword Puzzle
